**EASTERN WHITE PINE:**

Soft, light green blue needles, tolerates dry, rocky soil as well as wet, swampy areas. Excellent ornamental for specimen tree, naturalizing, and windbreaks. Fast grower. Can be used

for Christmas trees and timber.

FRASER FIR:

The premier Christmas tree with soft, dark green needles that hold well. Prefers cool, moist, well-drained soil; tolerates partial shade. Does not do well in heavy, wet, clay soils.

**COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE:**

Most popular spruce, blue-green, silvery needles, handsome as a single specimen or as a dense windbreak. Grows to 100 ft., in ordinary soil and average moisture. Plant six feet apart for windbreak.

APPLE TREE BUNDLE (1 of EACH):**ENTERPRISE APPLE:**

Late-maturing, deep red apple with good keeping qualities. Fruit is uniform and medium to large in size. Tree is vigorous and spreading, with good annual bearing habits. Enterprise is highly resistant to fire blight and cedar apple rust. Dwarf: 10 ft.

**HONEYCRISP APPLE:**

The fruit is mostly orange-red with a yellow background. This crisp, juicy, sweet apple has a rich flavor that has made it "#1" in taste panels. The fruit averages 3 inches and up, matures

ten days before Red Delicious and stores well.

Outstanding winter hardiness gives this variety excellent potential for northern growing regions.

Honeycrisp is moderately resistant to apple scab and fire blight. Semi-dwarf: 10-20ft.

SUMMER RAMBO APPLE:

Greenish-red variety with large fruit, juicy with a fine flavor, one of the preferred for summer sauce. Tree is vigorous and hardy, with large fruit, should not be used as a pollinator, fruit ripens late August-Mid September. Semi-dwarf: 10-20ft.

**REDHAVEN PEACH:**

Standard variety for the Northeast peach industry. Medium sized fruit that colors to a brilliant red. Trees are vigorous and bud hearty.

**CONTENDER PEACH:**

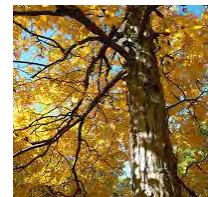
High quality freestone variety. Ripens mid-August with very firm, large fruit with excellent color. The trees are hardy and very productive.

SUGAR MAPLE:

Fast growth 60-75 feet with a spread of 45-50 feet. Brilliant yellow, burnt orange and limited red tones in the fall. Does not do well in wet areas.

SHAGBARK HICKORY:

Narrow upright growth to about 90 feet. Fall colors are yellow and golden tones. Popular for its sweet edible nuts. Trees start production around 25 years. Plant at least 10 for pollination.

**WINTERBERRY HOLLY:**

Deciduous holly growing 6-12 feet in height and spread. Female plants produce bright red berries. Likes acidic soil, will tolerate wet, swampy conditions.

**GRAY DOGWOOD:**

Grows to 15 feet with very dense green foliage that turns purple in the fall. Numerous small white flower clusters bloom in mid-June giving way to small white berries.



VIRGINIA GENTLEMAN'S MIX:

A showy mix of native grasses & wildflowers to meet the aristocrat's high expectation of color and long life. Major species included: little bluestem, virginia wildrye, blackeyed susan, oxeye sunflower, and aster. Majority of mix reaches 3-5 ft. annually. For full species composition contact the District.



WILDLIFE FOOD PLOT MIX:



Provides habitat and food for a variety of wildlife. Mix includes; milo, millet, buckwheat, and sunflower. Attractive to mourning doves, turkey, and deer. Remains standing in winter to provide shelter and an emergency food source. Seed in May or June.

5' TREE TUBE:

5' vented tree shelter. Provides protection from predators, wind, and chemical sprays. Promotes seedling growth. Attaches to stake with nylon ratchet ties.



2' SHRUB TUBE:



Provides protection from predators, wind, and chemical sprays. Promotes seedling growth. Attaches to stake with nylon ratchet ties. 2' high and approximately 5-6" in diameter.

5' OAK STAKE:

5' hardwood oak stake for anchoring tree and shrub shelters. Stakes are 1 inch thick with pointed end.
