**EASTERN WHITE PINE:**

Soft, light green-blue needles. Tolerates dry, rocky soil as well as wet, swampy areas. Excellent ornamental for specimen tree, naturalizing, and windbreaks. Fast grower. Can be used for Christmas trees and timber.

NORWAY SPRUCE:

Grows to 100' with silvery blue-green needles usually less than an inch in length. It thrives in well drained or moist soils. Handsome ornamental in single planting or dense screen/windbreak.

APPLE TREE BUNDLE (1 of EACH):**ROYAL RED HONEYCRISP®:**

Red strain of Honeycrisp® with same flavor and character as the original Honeycrisp®.

Semi-Dwarf: 15'

**GRANNY SMITH:**

A late green, tart, apple maturing in early November. Develops red blush in the NE. High-quality eating apple. Storage life equal to Fuji. Dwarf: 10'

**TRIUMPH®:**

Honeycrisp® x Liberty cross highly resistant to scab and cedar apple rust. Well balanced flavor with a hint of tartness. Stores up to 6 months. Semi-Dwarf: 15'

**PEAR TREE BUNDLE (1 of EACH):****HARROW SWEET:**

A late season pear with very good resistance to fire blight. Ripens three weeks after Bartlett.

**SUNRISE:**

Fruit color yellow with slight blush. Harvests two weeks before Bartlett, will store for two to three months. Impressive resistance to fire blight.



Firm, highly colored, variety of late season peach. The fruit is yellow fleshed and freestone. Winter hardy.

SCARLET OAK:

Grows 70-75' in height. Dark glossy green leaves in summer change to scarlet in fall. Prefers loamy, well drained soils. Excellent for ornamental and street tree plantings.

RIVER BIRCH:

Open pyramidal growth to 90'. Can tolerate wet soils. Bark is variable in color and exfoliates in curly paper sheets. Fall color is yellow.

**AMERICAN COMMON PERSIMMON**

Mature height 25-40'. White flowers are fragrant and desired by honeybees. Produces edible persimmons valuable for wildlife. More than one tree is needed for pollination.

**AMERICAN CHESTNUT HYBRID (potted):**

A fast growing hybrid reaching 80-100'. Produces rich flavorful chestnuts in 13-15 years. Best planted in full sun in well drained soils. More than one tree is needed for pollination.

**EMERALD GREEN ARBORVITAE (potted):**

Pyramidal plant growing 10-15'. Bright emerald green color all year. Grows 3-4' wide, very compact. Great for visual barrier and/or windbreak.

**BLACK CHOKEBERRY:**

Height 3-5' with a spread of up to 10'. Produces single white flowers in May and purplish-black berries in fall. Good for screening, naturalizing, and wildlife. Will grow in sandy soils and wet areas.

SILKY DOGWOOD:

Grows to 9' tall and wide. Grows best in well drained, moist soils. Berries attractive to many bird species. Great for stabilizing soils on eroding banks.

SHOWY ANNUAL/PERENNIAL WILDFLOWER MIX:

A mix of annual and perennial wildflowers. Major species include purple coneflower, black-eyed susan, and aster. Major annuals include blue flax, bachelor's buttons, and cosmos. Majority of mix reaches 4-5' annually. For full species composition contact the District.

**WILDLIFE FOOD PLOT MIX:**

Provides habitat and food for a variety of wildlife. Mix includes: milo, millet, buckwheat, and sunflower. Attractive to mourning doves, turkey, and deer. Remains standing in winter to provide shelter and an emergency food source. Seed in May or June.

5' TREE TUBE:

5' vented tree shelter. Provides protection from predators, wind, and chemical sprays. Promotes seedling growth. Attaches to stake with nylon ratchet ties.

**2' SHRUB TUBE:**

Provides protection from predators, wind, and chemical sprays. Promotes seedling growth. Attaches to stake with nylon ratchet ties. 2' high and approximately 5-6" in diameter.

5' OAK STAKE:

5' hardwood oak stake for anchoring tree and shrub shelters. Stakes are 1 inch thick with pointed end.

5' FIBERGLASS STAKE:

5' fiberglass stake for anchoring tree and shrub shelters.
